It would plant enother nest of communist propagandists and agents in machington and in every Chinese compulate over the Landle would betray millions of Chinese still struggling against a slave state.

The admission of communist China into the United Satings with the support of the United States would insultably result in all the object of the United States would add further to the already designantly destructive forces in the United Sations.

If the United Sations is ever to be useful to the huma race it must free itself of communist domination—not add to it.
